**Service Pupil Premium (SPP)** is money that is paid directly to state schools, free schools and academies across England for supporting Service children. The amount is £300 per child in Years R-11. The Premium was introduced by the Department for Education (DfE) as part of the commitment to delivering the Armed Forces Covenant. The premium enables schools to provide extra, mainly pastoral, support for children with parents in the British Armed Forces. This premium is for children of currently serving Service personnel, for those who have had a Service parent who has died in Service and also those who have left including through injury for up to a maximum of six years. If you have any further concerns or questions about SPP, speak to your Services' Family Federation.
